- Cherwell District Council (CDC) has one main privacy policy for how it handles your personal information, for further details please access: Privacy notice
- Data Controller: CDC (in this case the service organising this consultation) decides what
 personal info is needed from you to provide them (relevant service) with the baseline to query
 and gather feedback on relevant matters that will involve you, also meeting pre-set legal
 requirements.
- The performance and Insight team act as the intermediary between the parties, to ensure GDPR and consultation regulations are met and followed, having no ownership of any survey other than provide regulatory clarification and data analysis.

- Your Consent: By sharing your info and using CDC consultation tool services, you acknowledge that you understand this policy.
- They aim is to ensure services are transparent and give you control over your data.
- Updates: This privacy policy is reviewed at least once a year, with the last update on **02 October 2025.**
- Usage of Information: As an intermediary between the parties, we collect all provided info to
 deliver a data analysis summary to services and share the data with that specific service, which
 in turn may share it with other departments, councils, law enforcement, healthcare, and
 government bodies as needed and legally permitted, depending on your data sharing
 requirements.
- Data Matching: we also conduct data matching exercises to prevent fraud. This includes sharing data with other organizations for auditing public funds.
- Decision Making and Data Transfers: decisions about individuals and data stored are reviewed every 3 years, and if not relevant will be purged from our database, but this varies within each service compliant to rules and regulations.
- Data Retention: otherwise, data will be kept only as long as necessary for legal or business needs.
- Security: We conform with pre-set security measures to protect your data and train staff on data protection. In case of a data breach, you will be informed, as per rules and regulations.

- Children's Privacy: we do not knowingly collect personal information from children. If they find out they have, they will delete it.
